




GOVERNMENT WORK IS GOD'S WORK

Dr B.R. Ambedkar said "Political democracy rests on the foundation of social democracy. Social democracy is a way of life which recognizes liberty, equality and fraternity as principles of life. For political democracy to be strong, its foundation, social democracy, must be secure."







Ambedkar's wish is the wish of our government with an emphasis on building an equal society. Our government is now 100 days old. In these 100 days, our government has implemented important welfare schemes that have caught the attention of the nation in particular and world in general. We have implemented four of the 5 guarantee schemes that we had promised before the general elections. Yuva Nidhi scheme will also be launched soon.

We are spending around Rs 52,000 crores per year on these five welfare schemes for the people of Karnataka. Karnataka is the first state to transfer such a large amount of empowerment benefits directly to the people without any conditions, without any middlemen and without giving room for any corruption or malpractice. The main reason we implemented these schemes is that people are suffering, and their suffering should be alleviated as much as possible.

People were shaken by the tax burden and price rise. From cooking gas to petrol, diesel, rice, pulses, cooking oil, road toll, the prices have gone up across the board. Many economists have identified many Central government policies as the cause of this problem. In some taluks of the State, the per capita income of the people is not even 10

thousand rupees. Innumerable people depend on wage

labour, animal husbandry etc. for their livelihood. In such a situation, we have come up with guaranteed plans of Rs 4000 to Rs5000 per month. Because of this welfare impetus, people's spending and purchasing power will increase and the economy will speed up.

Women, who make up half of the population, are oppressed for generations. An economy without empowered woman is unimaginable. But the Manuvadi mindset, women are not allowed to enjoy the fruits of labour. Women's labour participation rate is very low compared to that of many other countries of the world. Given this background, the four guarantee schemes we have designed are women-centric, bringing a great revolution in the lives of women.

We have designed these schemes with the hope that there will be a qualitative change in people's lives. Countries leading the Human Development Index are undertaking social development initiatives under the concept of 'Universal Basic Income'. The welfare programmes of these countries have attracted the attention of world economists. These countries have changed the definition of development. Roads, water, drainage, street lights, and well-planned infrastructure are as important as schools and health systems. The concept of universal basic income is a model of great development that creates a happy environment for people. In

this background, we believe in Amartya Sen's premise that 'development is freedom' and we are implementing the same verbatim.

The day-to-day life of the people has been marred by corruption, violence and unrest in the name of caste and religion. It is for this reason that our government has taken up several cases for investigation in the fight against organized corruption. We have given a message to the anti-social forces that we will take strict action against those who take law in their hands. Our government believes in Pampa's motto 'Manushya Jati Tanonde Valam' (The entire mankind is one) and in the words of the National poet Kuvempu's wish of 'Sarva janangada shantiya thota' (a garden of peace for all people).

Our government has waged a war against hunger and malnutrition. Our motto is that no citizen of the country should sleep hungry. Indira Canteens are providing nutritious food to the underprivileged through these canteens. Our government provides eggs and other nutrition twice a week to school children.

We aim to improve the education system. As Kuvempu says, 'Our children must become nirankushamati (free-spirits).' We are making plans to change the situation where education is taught in such a way that the kid goes to the next class by encouraging critical thinking and developing intelligence, compassion and skills. Our government is of the opinion that society will be right only if the education is right.

Our government does not neglect the infrastructural development of the State by giving more importance to social development. Our government's core capex expenditure is in the areas of irrigation, roads, bridges, underground drainage, drinking water, power, transport, government buildings etc, as compared to any previous governments.



Our second guarantee scheme is **Griha Jyoti** which offers free electricity up to 200 units. The scheme came into effect from July 1 and customers are getting the facility from August 1 bill. About 2 crore customers will benefit from this scheme, so far 1.49 crore customers have registered and are getting electricity facility. free This facility is also extended to tenants. We are spending **Rs 13,910 crore annually** for this.




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Direct cash disbursement programs can provide the best solution for poverty alleviation. In this background, the state government is implementing the 'Griha Lakshmi' scheme. On August 30, the process of transferring Rs. 2000 per month to women's accounts is being initiated. So far 1.08 crore women head of the families have registered. From August 30, 1.08 crore household owners are receiving Rs 2000 each simultaneously. We are spending more than 30 thousand crores on this project alone.

This is the first time in the entire country that such a huge amount of money is being transferred to people's accounts without any conditions.














Yuva Nidhi is a scheme to support the youth who have obtained a degree or diploma and have not found a iob immediately so that they don't get disappointed and their self-esteem is not affected. Rs 3000 will be given to graduates who are unemployed for at least six months till they get a job or up to a maximum of two years and Rs 1,500 rupees for diploma holders. This scheme will be implemented 6 months after the end of the academic year 2022-23.













These guarantee schemes of ours will bring a lot of change in the lives of

poor and middle-class families irrespective of caste, creed, race or colour.











- 177 Indira canteens are active in the BBMP area. In addition to these, 50 new canteens will be opened.
- There are 197 Indira canteens in other urban local bodies across the state except BBMP, but they are in a dilapidated condition without proper maintenance. Therefore, 188 new Indira canteens will be established and old ones will be repaired at an expenditure of Rs.200 crores. Through these, more than 4.5 lakh people will have quality meals every day.
- Overall a total of 612 Indira canteens will be operational in the State including BBMP serving every day more than 7 lakh people. Indira Canteens exemplify our determination to make Karnataka hunger-free.
- Government has decided to pay Rs. 5- Rs. 10/- per plate additionally and provide quality food to the people at the older rates.







Programmes such as Krishi Bhagya, Anugraha Yojane, Vidyasiri, Indira Canteen, disbursal of scholarships to students of minority communities, among others, were effectively executed when the Congress government was in power in the past. However, these schemes were halted in the last few years.

Our government will reintroduce all such schemes.


"We have vowed to transform Karnataka into the number one state during our tenure not only in India, but also in the world. Ground reality has boosted our dream."







- As many as 15.73 lakh farmers have registered for crop insurance schemes on 14.87 lakh hectare land during the current financial year.
- The government has set up Raitha Kare Kendra (Farmers Call Centre) with a unique and uniformed number to redress grievances and to clarify doubts of farmers at field-level.









- Drip irrigation facility has been installed in 3573.72 hectare land owned by 3673 farmers.
- The government has supplied seven lakh horticultural seedlings cultivation crops, 169 tonnes and 4,969 litres of organic manure at reasonable prices.
- Steps have been taken to extend horticultural crops in 7307 hectare land and to revive horticultural crops in 453 hectares under various welfare measures for farmers
- Measures have been taken to adopt a conservation agriculture system in 165.26 hectares.
 About 143 farm ponds have been constructed to store rainwater and recharge ground water

- The government has allocated Rs 222.464 crore for the implementation of beneficiary-based schemes of the state and the central government during the year 2023-24
- The new building of silk cocoon market at government sericulture training school at Channapatna is now functional.
- Steps have been taken to introduce the 13th e-market at Santhemarahalli in Chamarajanagar district. Measures are taken to transfer funds directly to the accounts of sericulturists in 11 markets. E-payment is now a reality.
- A Centralised server room has come up at the sericulture directorate to monitor e-market activities of all silk cocoon markets in the state.

- The government has earmarked Rs 50 crore under Anugraha and Kamadhenu schemes to help farmers for the deaths of sheep and goats.
- Price of milk has been hiked by Rs 3 to protect interests of dairy farmers.
- The new building of Veterinary College at Athani in Belagavi district has been dedicated.
- Steps have been taken to disburse Rs 12 crore as compensation to owners of 5851 live stocks which died of lumpy skin disease
- The government has relaunched Anugraha schemes to help owners of sheep and goats. An amount of Rs 20 crore has been allocated to help owners of these live stocks in the event of deaths of sheep and goat.
- An amount of Rs 30 crore has been earmarked under Kamadhenu Distress Fund.
 This will be used to disburse among owners of cow, buffalo, bull etc for their unnatural deaths.
- In the last 100 days, Artificial insemination has been carried out on 9.09 lakh live

- An amount of Rs 3000 each was disbursed as monthly compensation to 22,158 fishermen under Savings-cum-relief Scheme during a ban on fishing activities. An amount of Rs 6.64 crore has been disbursed as compensation.

- The Karnataka Co-operative Societies Act,1959, was amended in the first Assembly session of this government to include Section 128 (A). This facilitates extension of service security of executive officers and secretaries of Primary Agricultural Credit Societies and Primary Milk Producers Co-operative Societies. This will also prevent misuse of funds in these societies.
- The government, in association with Karnataka State Agricultural Produce Processing
 Export Corporation Limited, has taken steps to set up mini cold storage facilities to preserve highly perishable fruits, flowers and vegetables and prevent farments from Farmers from making distress sale of these produces.

Increase in grants for SCSP/TSP

- An amount of Rs. 34,294 crore has been earmarked under Scheduled Caste Sub Plan (SCSP) and the Tribal Sub Plan (TSP) for the welfare of the members of Scheduled Castes and Tribes.
- There is a 13% i.e; Rs. 4031 crore increase as against the allocation made during previous year. The State Development Council has approved various action plans under SCSP/TSP. So far, an amount of Rs 2,945 crore has been spent spent so far.
- Steps are being taken to scrap section 7(D) of SCSP/TSP Act, 2013.
 This will ensure distribution of more funds for beneficiary-based programmes.
- The 2023 amendment bill to the Karnataka Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes (Prohibition of Transfer of Certain Lands) Act, 1978 (Act) by proposes a crucial amendment regarding the time limit for an application to restore granted lands to the original grant-

- ee. After the amendment, there is no time limit to lodge a complaint with the competent authority. The revenue department has amended this Act for the benefit of SC/ST people.
- The admission process is underway for schools managed by the Karnataka Residential Educational Institution Society. Admissions have been granted to 2.03 lakh students, including the old and the new ones.
- * Admissions have been given to all students of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes pursuing higher education in various colleges.

Tribal welfare

- An amount of Rs 9960.34 crore has been allocated for sub-plan of the Scheduled Tribe for 2023-24. An amount of Rs 1588.55 crore budgetary allocation has been made to the department.
- An amount of Rs 50 crore has been earmarked for the welfare of Soliga, Jenu Kuruba, Kadu Kuruba, Koraga, Iruliga, Betta Kuruba and other nomadic and semi-nomadic communities.
- The period of supplying nutritious food to 12 tribal communities in 8 districts of the state, including Jenu Kuruba, Soliga, Erava, Kadu kuruba, Male Kudiya, Siddi, Halasaru Goudalu, Gonda and Betta Kuruba has been increased from 6 months to 12 months.
- The government in association with Tribal Cooperative Marketing Development Federation of India has been taken steps to set up 100 forest produce cells to process and add value to forest produces.

Supplying nutritious food to 12 tribal communities in 8 districts has been increased from 6 months to

12 months.









- A total of 2.28 lakh students have been provided admission in 2,443 pre-metric and post-metric hostels.
- The Karnataka Veerashiva Lingayata Development Corporation has distributed Rs. 3.35 crores as loan to 359 students through DBT under its "Basava Belagu" scheme.
- Rs.7.2 crores have been released as a loan and subsidy to facilitate taking up self-employment under the "Kayaka Kirana" scheme.
- A loan of Rs. 5 lakh has been provided to one student under the "Videsha Vidyavikasa" scheme.
- Action has been taken to drill 175 borewells in the last 100 days under the "jeevajala" scheme.

 Unemployed youths from backward classes have been encouraged to take up self-employment by providing a subsidy of 50% or a maximum of Rs. 3 lakhs of the loan provided by the banks to purchase four-wheeler under the "Swavalambi Sarathi" scheme.

- Measures have been taken to provide reservations to backward classes in contracts of up to Rs.1 crore for castes which comes under category-1 and category-2A.
- Rs.10 crore has been provided as loans through the State Finance Corporation at an interest rate of 6% for industries promoted by those belonging to backward classes of category-1 and category-2A.
- Steps have been taken to provide Rs.20 lakh each at a 0% interest rate for students from backward classes pursuing their higher education at foreign universities.

Action has been taken to drill 175 borewells in the last 100 days







- The government has ordered to upgrade of 62 minority Morarji Desai residential schools as integrated schools to include classes from 6th to 12th and this will benefit 14,880 students.
- The government has ordered to double the number of admissions in 50 Morarji Desai residential schools and this will benefit an additional 12,500 students.
- The government has ordered to provide training for minority students along with their three-year degree courses to better prepare them for other examinations starting from the year 2023-24.

Bengaluru Metro

- DK Shivakumar with various stakeholders to transform Bengaluru City a global city under the concept The number of commuters in Namma Metro has been significantly increased.
 - Bengaluru Metro Rail Corporation earned an additional income in May 2023. While the operating profit stood at Rs. 47.97 its operating expenditures were Rs. 45.62 crores.
 - The works of Namma Metro connecting Baiyappanahalli and Krishnarajapuram have been completed and rolling stock trials have been in progress.
 - The work on the tunnelway between Dairy Circle and Nagavara has been in progress. Work of 1,490 metres has been completed in the last 100 days.

Bengaluru Water Supply and Sewage Board:

- A project worth Rs. 5,550 crores with financial aid from JICA has been approved to take up the works of the 5th phase of the Cauvery Drinking Water Supply project.
- The works to upgrade the old water treatment plants at Koramangala and Challaghtta valleys to prevent polluting of Bellanduru and Varturu lakes by spending Rs. 610 crores have been in progress.
- The works of a 7MLD capacity water treatment plant in Puttenahalli near Yelahanka at an expense of Rs. 24.51 crores, a 5MLD capacity water treatment plant in Kaggadssapura at a cost of Rs.17.90 crores, and a 3MLD capacity water treatment plant in Hesaraghatta at a cost of Rs.11.99 crores will be completed by the end of the year.
